Beer	Tasting Notes (with help from the CAMRA GBG)	Your Notes
Smash 4.4% Bedlam Brewery East Sussex	Golden Promise barley malt, arguably the best pale ale malt in the world is full of soft honey smoothness and is the only malt used in this beer to give a perfect platform to show off the Mosaic hop. Mosaic is used to bitter, to late hop and dry hop the beer. This powerful complex hop crams the taste and aroma with tropical fruit, citrus, peaches and apricots.	
Spokes 4.1% Fixed Wheel Brewery West Midlands	A light refreshing blonde ale combining cascade and centennial hops to give flavours of lemon and lychees to sit on top of a sweet malt base.	
No Brainer 4.4% St. Peters Brewery Suffolk	Hops: Pilgrim; Mandarins; Williamette and Crystal. Full bodied pale ale with a fruity aroma, subtle citrus taste and a delicious hoppy finish.	
Rendevous No. 9 4.4 % Fool Hardy Brewery Greater Manchester	Hops: Summit, Chinook and Columbus. Full bodied, bold and fruity. The blend of American hops during brewing gives the beer bags of taste with exceptional poise, crisp citrus notes and aroma.	
Plummeth the Hour 4.5% Old Sawley Brewery Nottinghamshire	Hops: Progress. A traditional porter with roasted treacle flavours brewed with plum essence to give a soft plum fruity character.	
Jobber 4.3% Old Sawley Brewery Nottinghamshire	Hops: Fuggles and Goldings. Appearance: Amber. Balanced between a strong malt backbone and a floral hop character, it makes for a great example of the Best Bitter style.	
Trilogy 3.9% Three Brothers Brewery Tyneside	A thirst quenching citrus blonde showcasing Azzacca, Citra and Simcoe hops to give a beautiful lemon and orange aroma , moreish hoppy flavour and a light bitter finish. A fantastic session beer.	
Au Gold 4.2% Three Brothers Brewery Tyneside	Hops: Cascade; Centennial; Citra and Styrian Wolf Named simply due to its colour and style, this golden ale is a real session drink. It is light and refreshing with subtle citrus and floral notes coming from the cascade and centennial hops.	
Mud City Stout 6% Sadler's Brewery West Midlands	Hops: Goldings and Northern Brewer. Brewed with raw cocoa; vanilla pods; flaked oats; wheat and a blend of beautifully dark malts.	
Jackalope 4.2% Backyard Brew House West Midlands	Hops: Cascade; Columbus; Nelson Sauvin and Simcoe. An American style amber ale, sweet and malty. Complex hop character with fruity citrus notes and a hint of spice and resin.	
Voodoo 4.5% Salopian Brewery Shropshire	Hops: Ekuanot and Motueka. A crisp and beautifully fresh golden ale with an aroma of citrus and passionfruit with a tart palate which rises into a fruit filled crescendo.	
Green Hop 4.1% Cornish Crown Brewery Cornwall	Fresh and bright pale ale made with 25kg of unprocessed Challenger hops. The unprocessed hops provide a more floral hoppy beer compared to the processed hops which are dried and tend to have a more bitter flavour profile.	
Causeway 4.1% Cornish Crown Brewery Cornwall	Mid brown/dark amber in colour. Light to medium bitterness. Made with pale and crystal malts, Pilgrim bittering hops, and Summit and Fuggles aroma hops.	
Helter Skelter 4.2% Cornish Crown Brewery Cornwall	Chinook, Pioneer, Nelson Sauvin and Summitt hops are added at three stages of the brew (triple hopped).	
Porter 5.2% Cornish Crown Brewery Cornwall	Extra special Christmas porter made with 5 different malts and infused with extra Madagascar Bourbon vanilla.

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S.P.A. 4.8% Cornish Crown Brewery Cornwall	Pale gold in colour, strong yet easy drinking, with medium to strong bitterness. Made with pale malt. Summit bittering hops with Hallertau Mittelfrüh and Pilgrim aroma hops give a strong citrus finish.	
Red IPA 5.9% Cornish Crown Brewery Cornwall	A strong India Pale Ale with a distinctive red hue. Medium bitterness. Made with pale and a touch of crystal malts. Well hopped with Nelson Sauvin and Cascade.	
Penny Come Quick 4.5% Skinners Brewery Cornwall	As stouts go, it's not the most stout of stouts, but at 4.5% ABV it packs a great flavour punch. It has a smooth, creamy body, reminiscent of a higher abv brew, with roast malt notes, of course, but also light coffee, vanilla and Swiss milk chocolate. There's gentle bitterness on the finish and an aroma of chocolate mousse.	
Affinity 4.8% Lacons Brewery Norfolk	Pale and malty with a hint of noble hops (Admiral). Very easy drinking!	
Lyme Bay Jack Ratt Session Scrumpy 4.9% Lyme Bay Winery Devon	A medium clear session cider.	
Stan's Cheddar Valley 6% Thatchers Somerset	With its distinctive orange hues, this smooth, robust, naturally cloudy cider is a Somerset tradition. For those who like oak-aged cider medium dry, our cider makers choose apples including Tremlett's Bitter for its tannins, while Dabinett brings a rich, full body.	

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
